Hull — The 12th annual Hull Congress was easily the strongest ever held. J.P.Lawson writes 'The Open was won jointly by Stephen Berry and Roelof Westra 4½/5. Eq. 3rd D.R.Johnston, G.P.Hildred, J.W.Atkinson, N.Lazonby and G.W.Chandler (NZ) 4. The talking point of the Congress was the play of Chandler. At only 15 years of age, he is already a world class junior, having finished 16th in the world championships. Had it not been for a blunder in time-trouble against Berry in the fourth round, he would surely have won the tournament.

The Major tournament produced the only 100% record in the 113 strong Congress when S.S.LeBlancq won with 5/5. Eq. 2nd T.Harper, A.W.G.Overy & P.R.Baslington 4½/.
